

**International Relations and European Integration
CURRICULUM 2017/2018**

(License no 6044 HTM, from November 4, 2010)
60 ECTS credit points

The aim of the curriculum is to provide knowledge and skills necessary for working within the field of international affairs. The studies are organized as a full-time evening course with classes on 4 afternoons per week from 16:45 to 19:45. The courses include classroom work (lectures and seminars) and independent work. The latter constitutes 3/4 of the whole curriculum.

The total amount of credit points obtainable is 75. The program is considered completed when at least 60 credit points have been collected - 30 credit points of compulsory courses (marked as C) and 30 credit points of optional courses (marked as O).
